OVERVIEW

Electricians plan, wire, and test electrical systems in homes and businesses everywhere. There are multiple levels of electrician, mostly based on the knowledge and certifications you have.

Entry-level usually only require a **Basic Electricity Certificate**, which prepares people to work with electricity on a daily basis. After certification, lots of training happens on the job or even in formal apprenticeships.

Further formal education is also available, such as the **Industrial Electronics/Electricity Diploma**. This prepares individuals for potentially higher-paying, more specialized jobs in industrial companies.
